


Dierks Bentley, cocktail bars and a music venue: Step inside the renovated Hutton Hotel

Hutton Hotel Nashville is doubling down on its music-themed accommodations that cater to Music City's creative class.

The hotel on West End Avenue recently completed a multimillion-dollar renovation. With upgrades throughout the 247-room hotel, Hutton also added a bar, restaurant, music venue, cocktail lounge and spaces for songwriters.


Country music superstar <u>Dierks Bentley</u> and OneRepublic frontman <u>Ryan</u> <u>Tedder</u> collaborated on what is perhaps the most notable addition to the hotel, the Writers Studios. Aimed at songwriters, these spaces are outfitted with equipment and designed to inspire.

Also new is Analog, a 5,000-square-foot music venue on the ground floor of the hotel with two levels for live entertainment. Studio 11 Design of Dallas and Nashville's Tuck Hinton Architects designed the 300-person venue.

"Hutton Hotel Nashville is continuing to redefine how guests experience Music City," Hutton General Manager Jonathan Bartlett said in a news release. "The combination of exceptional service, residential-style rooms, a music venue for displaying creativity, an inventive dining experience and the writing spaces for artists serve the needs of our life-long clients and fosters a new generation of Hutton fans who are seeking inspiration from their travel experiences."
